

Study in AUSTRALIA



Study has found that Australia is increasingly being selected by international students, not just from SE Asia but from all parts of the globe. The reasons for this are not difficult to understand: Australia offers a multitude of advantages for many students and in addition offers a life style which few other places can match.

There are 40 government funded universities in Australia, controlled by State and Federal legislation. Australia welcomes over 80,000 International students a year, from all over the world. There are a wide variety of courses and degrees at universities in Australia making it easy to find what is right for you. Australia has a Standardized National System of Qualification that is recognized and respected globally. Australia's multicultural society means that international students are readily accepted, and network of fellow students provide good support. Australia has a long history of educating International Students and is one of the top ten spenders on research and development, making it a world leader in fields ranging from telecommunications to cultural studies. From a population of just 19 million there have been 7 Nobel Prize winners.

Students who study in Australia with a full student visa are permitted to work in Australia on a casual basis for up to 20 hours a week during course time, and full time during vacation. This earning potential makes it much more affordable for students who need to fund part of their studies through work. There are many employment possibilities for these wishing to work.

Australia is a comparatively safe, stylish, growing country with a clean environment, a spirit of fun and adventure, a passion for sport and all things 'outdoors' and an established art/music and café scene. The people are famous for being open, friendly, welcoming and relaxed. There are 19 millions Australians living in a country roughly the same size as Mainland USA. Of these 7.8 million were born outside Australia or are children of those born outside of Australia. It is one of the most multicultural societies in the world. (There are more languages spoken in Sydney than any other city in the world.) There are more than 100 ethnic groups. Each year the number of International Students choosing to study in Australia increases and Australia currently has the third largest international student enrolment.
